**Anti-Ragging Committees:** Institutions are mandated to set up anti-ragging committees to investigate and take action against offenders.

**Strict Punishments:** Perpetrators can face suspension, expulsion, or even legal action, making the consequences severe.

**Counseling:** Counseling and support services are offered to victims to help them cope with the trauma.
